Church Fenton architect to feature in national magazine

A CHURCH Fenton architect's innovative house designs feature in this month's Daily Telegraph Homebuilding & Renovating Magazine.

Andrew Brown, inset, who recently relocated from London to Church Fenton, has been awarded the national magazine's Best DIY Project for 2008, after submitting details of his recently completed three bedroom 'upside down' house which sits on a hilltop overlooking the market town of Penistone, South Yorkshire.

Andrew, whose business is called designSpace architecture, took on the solo project for his parents, Roger and Linda Brown, as a home for their retirement.

His parents built the award-winning home on the site of Andrew's grandfather's old bungalow.

It now features in the December issue of the national Daily Telegraph Homebuilding & Renovating Magazine magazine and has been attracting a lot of attention.

The buildings unique form was generated from the original dwelling with the addition

of a side and first floor extension. with the sweeping roof designed to knit old and new together.

Local Yorkshire stone is used for the main body of the building and the first floor is clad in a

Canadian red cedar wood sourced from sustainable forests.

The building also has substantial green credentials and although it's given Andrew his first solo award he is certainly no stranger to working on high-profile projects.

Whilst living in the south, he worked on many award-winning projects at locations including the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London and Poole harbour.
